This Grade II listed Georgian building was originally built in 1772 as a private residence by Thomas Lucas, a wealthy merchant and treasurer of Guy's Hospital, on the site of a medieval farmhouse. In 1796, Sir Francis Baring bought the house and grounds from Mrs. Angerstein, formerly Mrs. Lucas. He then bought the Manor of Lee and the house became the Manor House.

C & D Restoration Ltd was commissioned to carry out extensive internal and external works including a new stone extension.

Internal

- New Portland stone floor to entrance & staircase up to 1st floor
- York stone paving to basement

External

- Remedial stone repairs & pointing to external stonework
- New Portland stone extension & steps
- Stone indents used to repair original decayed stonework
- Portland stone copings to new extension & original building

C & D Restoration Ltd was required to complete the works to a strict schedule in order for the library to reopen to the general public on time.
