Selwood Terrace, Selwood Place & Elm Place are late Georgian, 1824-6, their “primness” contrasting with “the lively” quoins, balconies and shaped dormers of Neville Terrace, opposite, of 1863, some forty years later. The owner of the Georgian development was Samuel Ware who built Burlington Arcade, Piccadilly, in 1819. The neo-Georgian Regency Terrace of 1960-4 was by Raymond J. Sargent.

C & D Restoration Ltd was commissioned to carry out the relevant design work and produce detail working drawings in order to match the existing features.
